Dear Family!

God's laws are the outward expression of the covenant. Most human laws have limitations and loopholes. There are and will be different ways of interpreting those human laws contrary to its original intent. There have been and continue to be many attempts to turn and twist the original intent of God's law that have been handed down to us. That is the reason Prophet Jeremiah longed for a better way to communicate God's Law: "I will put my law within them, and I will write it upon their hearts."

As we grow deeper into the mystery of the season of Lent, we grow in maturity and come to a deeper realization of God. The first reading spells out what it would take to be people of the Covenant. As God called me into a solemn covenantal relationship with Him, my life (words, actions and intentions) need to reflect the sentiments of the Covenant. Jesus in the Gospel reveals to us that He is the embodiment of the law, that people learn from Jesus how to live the Covenantal Life.

Jesus is seen with the Father in His Creative Spirit. Everything comes from God. By cleansing the Temple, Jesus shows himself that he cares for the human-race. A certain cleansing is needed to be part of the Covenantal Life. The very act of cleansing is powerful - He is our Lord and God! God creates everything with a great love. Our births are acts of God's great love. The God who gave you life, saves you and purifies you. He washes our sins with his blood. That is how he cleanses us.

Jesus does not say, 'I will tear down this temple', instead, 'if you destroy this temple'. Destruction has been part of our nature. But cleansing, rebuilding and purifying have been the response of God, because God loves and cares for us. Let us find ways to respond to that creative, cleansing love of God.

First Scrutiny for the RCIA Catechumens

On the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, Catholic Churches with adults preparing to be baptized at the Easter Vigil will perform three successive rites called "the Scrutinies". These rites, with roots dating back to the early Church, are part of a larger process called the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) or by the new name since 2021, Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA).

In our parish, we pray for our three catechumens Preston Cryan, Emmanuel Sostre, & Tairina Paul as they prepare themselves to receive baptism. Please remember all the catechumens and candidates that are receiving their sacraments at Easter Vigil. For Scrutinies, the readings from YEAR A are used at mass.

Bible Study on Mark: All are welcome! As you probably know, it takes hours of preparation to put together one lesson. I thank all those who have signed up for these study. The more you show interest, the more I am encouraged to cater to your needs. Lent is a good time to begin something of this nature - to reflect and pray with the Word of God. We have begun the new Bible Study on The Acts of the Apostles last Thursday. It is never too late to join the study. Every time you participate you would appreciate the rich treasures of the Wisdom of the Word of God. This will be in preparation for the Easter Season 2024.




- All enrolled candidates should have the following handed in by now: the Confirmation Sponsor Certification and the Saint Project and Christian Charity forms.



DEACON'S CORNER

What Is a Permanent Deacon? (Part 1 of 5)

For many, deacons are a bit of a mystery. We see them at Mass, in various ministries, at the supermarket and with their families, but we don't quite fit into the Church categories many of us grew up with. Are we junior priests or some form of religious brothers? Are we clergy or perhaps a kind of hybrid? In light of this confusion we can ask, just what are permanent deacons?

Like bishops and priests, deacons are members of the clergy who receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders – not to the priesthood, but unto sacred service. According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

We share in Christ's mission and grace in a special way. The Sacrament of Holy Orders marks us with an imprint which cannot be removed, and which configures us to Christ, who made Himself the deacon servant of all. Among other tasks, it is the task of deacons to assist the bishop and priests in the celebration of the divine mysteries, above all the Eucharist, in the distribution of Holy Communion, in assisting at the blessing of marriages, in the proclamation of the Gospel and preaching, in presiding over funerals, and in dedicating ourselves to the various ministries of charity.

From The Passion of Sts. Perpetua and Felicity, begun by St. Perpetua herself, and completed by an eye-witness to the martyrdom

18. Now dawned the day of their victory, and they went forth from the prison into the amphitheater as it were into heaven, cheerful and bright of countenance; if they trembled at all, it was for joy, not for fear. Perpetua followed behind, glorious of presence, as a true spouse of Christ and darling of God; at whose piercing look all cast down their eyes. Felicity, likewise, rejoicing that she had borne a child in safety, that she might fight with the beasts, came now from blood to blood, from the midwife to the gladiator, to wash after her travail in a second baptism. And when they had been brought to the gate and were being compelled to put on, the men the dress of the priests of Saturn, the women the dress of the priestesses of Ceres, the noble Perpetua remained of like firmness to the end and would not. For she said: For this cause came we willingly unto this, that our liberty might not be obscured. For this cause we have devoted our lives, that we might do no such thing as this; this we agreed with you. Injustice acknowledged justice; the tribune suffered that they should be brought forth as they were, without more ado. Perpetua began to sing, as already treading on the Egyptian's head. Revocatus and Saturninus and Saturus threatened the people as they gazed. Then when they came into Hilarian's sight, they began to say to Hilarian, stretching forth their hands and nodding their heads: You judge us, they said, and God you. At this the people being enraged besought that they should be vexed with scourges before the line of gladiators (those namely who fought with beasts). Then truly they gave thanks because they had received somewhat of the sufferings of the Lord. (St. John Chrysostom)

March 8 - Optional St. John of God, Religious

The archbishop called John of God to him in response to a complaint that he was keeping tramps and immoral women in his hospital. In submission John fell on his knees and said: "The Son of Man came for sinners, and we are bound to seek their conversion.

I am unfaithful to my vocation because I neglect this, but I confess that I know of no bad person in my hospital except myself alone, who am indeed unworthy to eat the bread of the poor." The archbishop could only trust in John's sincerity and humility and dismissed him with deep respect.

March 9 - Optional St. Frances of Rome, Religious Malcolm Muggeridge's book Something Beautiful for God contains this quote from Mother Teresa about each sister in her community: "Let Christ radiate and live his life in her and through her in the slums. Let the poor seeing her be drawn to Christ and invite him to enter their homes and lives." Says Frances of Rome: "It is most laudable in a married woman to be devout, but she must never forget that she is a housewife. And sometimes she must leave God at the altar to find Him in her housekeeping" (Butler's Lives of the Saints).

Las leyes de Dios son la expresión exterior del convenio. La mayoría de las leyes humanas tienen limitaciones y lagunas. Hay y habrá diferentes maneras de interpretar esas leyes humanas contrarias a su intención original. Ha habido y sigue habiendo muchos intentos de cambiar y tergiversar la intención original de la ley de Dios que nos ha sido transmitida. Esa es la razón por la que el profeta Jeremías anhelaba una mejor manera de comunicar la Ley de Dios: "Pondré mi ley dentro de ellos, y la escribiré en sus corazones".

A medida que profundizamos en el misterio de la temporada de cuaresma, crecemos en madurez y llegamos a una comprensión más profunda de Dios. La primera lectura explica lo que se necesitaría para ser pueblo del convenio. Jesús no dice: "Yo derribaré este templo", sino "si tú destruyes este templo". La destrucción ha sido parte de nuestra naturaleza. Pero la limpieza, la reconstrucción y la purificación han sido la respuesta de Dios, porque Dios nos ama y nos cuida. Encontremos maneras de responder a ese amor creativo y limpiador de Dios.
