Fourth Sunday of Lent

Dear Family!

'Laetare' (Rejoice) Sunday (In Advent we have 'Gaudete') is a mid-point of reference to look back at our Lenten Journey and thank God for those moments of purification and enlightenment and ask God's grace to give us more opportunities to see the Light of Christ in the remaining weeks of Lent. As there are two kinds of blind people - physically and spiritually, there are two kinds of people who can see!

It is interesting to note both Laetare and Gaudete come from Latin root which are principally used to express joy. "The difference between the two is that Laetare reflects a joy that is manifest outwardly whereas Gaudete reflects a way of rejoicing internally" (The Mouth Piece). The Rose color of 'Gaudete' is a softening of violet; it is violet approaching white. It anticipates the pure white of the Resurrection of Jesus.

We invited all our RCIA candidates last Sunday for the 9am mass for the First Scrutiny. We had a great opportunity to pray for them. As they continue to grow in their faith and love for the Church, we support them and encourage them with our prayers.

This 'Laetare' Sunday we have the 'Second Scrutiny' for the Catechumens. Thus, the Gospel for the Scrutiny is from John 9:1-41. One of the powerful themes of Christology is Christ being the Light. Lent is also seen as the period of 'Purification and Enlightenment.' Meditatively reflecting on the gospel, reveals to us that there is an inward journey taking place in us when we encounter Christ. This journey from darkness of sin to light of Christ requires a progressive movement of fixing our whole being to Jesus.

Second Scrutiny for the RCIA Candidates

On the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent, Catholic Churches with adults preparing to be baptized at the Easter Vigil will perform three successive rites called "the Scrutinies". These rites, with roots dating back to the early Church, are part of a larger process called the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) or by the new name since 2021, Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA). In our parish, we pray for our three catechumens Preston Cryan, Emmanuel Sostre, & Tairina Paul as they prepare themselves to receive baptism. Please remember all the candidates who are receiving their sacraments at the Easter Vigil. For Scrutinies, the readings from YEAR A are used at mass.

Bible Study: All are welcome! As you probably know, it takes hours of preparation to put together one lesson. I thank all those who have signed up for this study. The more you show interest, the more I am encouraged to cater to your needs. Lent is a good time to begin something of this nature - to reflect and pray with the Word of God. We have begun the new Bible Study on The Acts of the Apostles on 29th of Feb. Every Thursday at 1:30pm in Mercy Hall we gather to study the scripture. It is never too late to join the study. Every time you participate you will appreciate the rich treasures of the Wisdom of the Word of God. This will be in preparation for the Easter Season 2024.



DEACON'S CORNER

What Is a Permanent Deacon? (Part 2 of 5)

Although the Second Vatican Council restored the diaconate to its permanent place within the hierarchy, its roots stretch to apostolic times. The first seven deacons were instituted to assist the apostles in the mission of the Church (see Acts 6:1-6). Stephen boldly proclaimed the Gospel and was the first martyr (Acts 6:8-15; 7:54-60). Philip, known as the Evangelist, catechized and baptized (Acts 8:26-40). In his letter to Timothy, St. Paul describes the qualities of a deacon:

Deacons likewise must be serious, not doubletongued, not addicted too much wine, not greedy for gain, they must hold the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience. Let deacons be the husband to one wife and let them manage their children and their households well; for those who serve well as deacons gain a good standing for themselves and also great confidence in the faith which is in Christ Jesus. (1 Timothy 3:8-10, 12-13).

Later, during the patristic era, they became the bishop's right-hand man, often given the responsibilities of financial management along with the distribution of food and alms to the poor. According to St. Ignatius of Antioch, writing in A.D. 108:

Deacons, too, who are ministers of the mysteries of Jesus should in all things be pleasing to all people. For they are not mere servants with food and drink, but emissaries of God's Church. Similarly, all should respect the deacons as Jesus Christ, just as all should regard the bishop as the image of the Father, and the clergy as God's senate and the college of the apostles. Without these three orders you cannot begin to speak of a church. (Letter to the Trallians)

MEMORIALS AND FEASTS THIS WEEK 4th Sunday of Lent (March 10)

Pope Benedict XVI on IV Sunday of Lent, 26 March 2006

This Fourth Sunday of Lent, traditionally known as "Laetare Sunday", is permeated with a joy which, to some extent, attenuates the penitential atmosphere of this holy season: "Rejoice Jerusalem!", the Church says in the Entrance Antiphon, "Be glad for her... you who mourned for her". The refrain of the Responsorial Psalm echoes this invitation: "The memory of you, Lord, is our joy".

To think of God gives joy. We spontaneously ask ourselves: but why should we rejoice? One reason, of course, is the approach of Easter. The expectation of Easter gives us a foretaste of the joy of the encounter with the Risen Christ. The readings remind us that despite our unworthiness, God's infinite mercy is destined for us. God loves us in a way that we might call "obstinate" and enfolds us in his inexhaustible tenderness.

The history of the Chosen People, who suffered God's punishment as a consequence of their rebellious behavior: the temple was destroyed and the people in exile no longer had a land; it truly seemed that God had forgotten them. Then, however, they saw that God, through punishment, pursues a plan of mercy. It was to be the destruction of the Holy City and the temple.

And then the Lord, demonstrating the absolute primacy of his initiative over every purely human effort, was to make use of a pagan, King Cyrus of Persia, to set Israel free. In thinking of the past centuries, we can see that God continues to love us even when he punishes us. Even when God's plans pass through trial and punishment, they always aim at an outcome of mercy and forgiveness.

This is what the Apostle Paul confirmed for us in the Second Reading, recalling that "God, who is rich in mercy, out of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead through our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ" (Eph 2: 4-5). As we know, "giving" on the part of the Father had a dramatic development: it even went to the point of the sacrifice of the Son on the Cross. If Jesus' entire mission in history is an eloquent sign of God's love, his death, in which God's redeeming tenderness is fully expressed, is quite uniquely so. Always, but particularly in this Lenten Season, our meditation must be centered on the Cross. In it we contemplate the glory of the Lord that shines out in the martyred body of Jesus.

God's greatness, his being love, becomes visible precisely in this total gift of himself. It is the glory of the Crucified One that every Christian is called to understand, live and bear witness to with his life.

The Cross - the giving of himself on the part of the Son of God - is the definitive "sign" par excellence given to us so that we might understand the truth about man and the truth about God: we have all been created and redeemed by a God who sacrificed his only Son out of love. This is why the Crucifixion, as I wrote in the Encyclical <u>Deus Caritas Est</u>, "is the culmination of that turning of God against himself in which he gives himself in order to raise man up and save him. This is love in its most radical form" (n. 12).

CHRISM MASS

The Bishop will also bless and consecrate the Holy Oils, which each parish receives for the rites of anointing. The Oil of Catechumens is used to anoint infants and adults before their Baptism; the Oil of the Sick is used on the forehead and hands of the infirm in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; and Sacred Chrism is used to anoint the head of the newly baptized, the foreheads of *confirmandi*, the hands of a priest at his ordination, the head of a bishop at his ordination, and the altar and walls of new churches.

Cuarto domingo de Cuaresma

¡Querida familia!

El domingo 'Laetare' (Alégrate) (en Adviento tenemos 'Gaudete') es un punto medio de referencia para mirar hacia atrás en nuestro viaje de Cuaresma y agradecer a Dios por esos momentos de purificación e iluminación y pedir la gracia de Dios para darnos más oportunidades de ver la Luz de Cristo en las semanas restantes de Cuaresma. Así como hay dos clases de personas ciegas: física y espiritualmente, ¡hay dos clases de personas que pueden ver!

Es interesante notar que tanto Laetare como Gaudete provienen de raíces latinas que se usan principalmente para expresar alegría. "La diferencia entre los dos es que Laetare refleja una alegría que se manifiesta exteriormente mientras que Gaudete refleja una manera de regocijarse interiormente" (La Boquilla). El color rosa de 'Gaudete' es un suavizado del violeta; es un violeta que se acerca al blanco. Anticipa el blanco puro de la Resurrección de Jesús.

Invitamos a todos nuestros candidatos de RICA el domingo pasado a la misa de las 9 am para el Primer Escrutinio. Tuvimos una gran oportunidad de orar por ellos. A medida que continúan creciendo en su fe y amor por la Iglesia, los apoyamos y alentamos con nuestras oraciones.

Este Domingo 'Laetare' tenemos el 'Segundo Escrutinio' para los Catecúmenos. Así, el Evangelio para el Escrutinio es de Juan 9:1-41.
