Dear Family!

Reflection: We are celebrating 'Gaudete Sunday' (Laetare Sunday in Lent) as the Universal Church rejoices in the Lord because 'the Lord is near' echoing the Opening Prayer, "we who look forward to the birthday of Christ, experience the joy of salvation and celebrate that feast with love and thanksgiving."

Self-knowledge is indispensable to all. Socrates is known for his wisdom of 'knowing thyself'. Thomas Merton said, "The first step toward finding God, who is Truth, is to discover the truth about myself: and if I have been in error, this first step to truth is the discovery of my error."

Self-knowledge is the gift of God. John the Baptist shows a great depth in self-knowledge: I am not the Christ, I am not Elijah, and I am not the Prophet. Self-knowledge leads us to better understand and appreciate our vocation: to be the voice for God. He shows a great depth of humility in accepting his vocation when he said that he is just a voice in the desert and when the Messiah comes, he is not fit to untie the sandals. We should note here that the slaves take pride in untying their master's sandals. John the Baptist stretches the limits of his humility to not even be called a slave. Self-knowledge prepares us to accept and live our vocation in the spirit of humility.

The coming of the Messiah is indeed a preparation of the self. The more we commit ourselves in understanding and loving our own selves as God wants us to, the committed we will be in getting ready to welcome him. The Word of God needs a straight path to our hearts and to our society. The Word of God needs a strong and vibrant voice. We are the voice of the Word.

Let us invoke the blessings of God to reveal to us what we want to know. Let our self-knowledge bring joy and happiness to us and to our society. Let our voices turn the hearts of people to God. Only then we can show people like John the Baptist, "Behold the Lamb of God."

ST. MARK BIBLE STUDY RECAP OF 12-06-23

The Way of Discipleship - (8:27 - 10:52)

This Lesson focused on the **Calming of the Storm** and the **Liberation of the Man tormented by Demons.** The following reflections are from *The Gospel of Mark by Mary Healy*.

- In the calming of the storm, Mark narrates this event not only to recount the memorable event of the storm, but also to reflect the experience of the early Christians. The boat with the disciples and Jesus Christ is an image of the Church. The small and struggling early Church, storm-tossed on the seas of the vast Roman Empire, must have sometimes wondered why their Lord seemed to be asleep in the stern, absent, unaware, and unconcerned about the mortal perils that threatened them. How often have His disciples, throughout the ages, felt that way in the midst of storms of persecution, natural disasters or personal troubles? But Jesus' authority is without limit, and although He allows trials, in the end, nothing can truly harm those who trust in Him.
- The Gerasene demoniac is a graphic example of the dehumanizing effect of evil and the tyranny it gives demons over human beings. It is evident that what is needed for this man's salvation is not merely conversion and reform of life, but deliverance: the expulsion of evil spirits and their influence that only the Son of God can accomplish. Although this is obvious in this man's case, it is also true to a lesser degree in everyday human life. Because of original sin, Satan has acquired a certain domination over all human beings. In all of us the image of God is defaced to some degree. Thus, the Rite of Baptism is always preceded by an exorcism, banishing any evil spirits that may have insinuated themselves into a person's life. Jesus' exorcism of the demoniac gives us an insight into what His work of redemption has accomplished for every one of us. Jesus, I Trust in You!

HOMILY OF POPE FRANCIS on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe

Tuesday, December 12, 2023

The first thing that comes to mind is the image of the Virgin printed on the tilma.

It is the image of the first disciple of the mother of believers, of the Church itself, which remains imprinted in the humility of what we are and have, which is not worth much, but which will be something great in the eyes of God. She is printed on the tilma.

The Virgin asks Juan Diego for a small job, to pick some flowers. Flowers, in mysticism, mean the virtues that the Lord instills in the heart, they are not our work. The act of collecting them reveals to us that God wants us to welcome this gift, to perfume our weak reality with good works, eliminating hatred and fears.

If you look at the message of Guadalupe, the words of the Virgin: "Am I not here, for I am your mother?", they take on a new meaning. That "being" of the Virgin, that "being" is to remain permanently imprinted on those poor clothes, perfumed by virtues collected in a world that seems incapable of producing them. Virtues that fill our poverty in the simplicity of small gestures of love, which illuminate our tilma, without us realizing it, with the image of a Church that carries Christ in its womb.

The image, the tilma, the roses, this is the message. It's that simple, without gloss. Along with the assurance that She is my mother, that She is here. And this message defends us from so many social and political ideologies with which this Guadeloupian reality is so frequently used to justify itself and make money. The Guadalupe message does not tolerate ideologies of any kind. Just the image, the tilma, the roses.


