

Palm Sunday

Dear Family!

As we begin Holy Week 2024, let us be reminded that we strive to be holy in both word and deed as holiness is overwhelmingly internal. We see Jesus marching into Jerusalem and people welcoming Jesus with palms in their hands as palms stand for victory. They want Jesus to win a war! Little did they know what he is waging the war against! We may be preoccupied with palms that we may forget the presence and importance of the donkey.

Let us be reminded that those palms are actually for peace - the royal anthem of Jesus is peace! 'Donkey' is traditionally seen in the Eastern concept as the image of peace and humility. This is about time our hands hold fast to the palms that are oriented towards the donkey as our Lord and Savior rides into the inroads of our hearts.

The Readings are organized uniquely as the 1st and 2nd readings are the same every year (Isaiah 50:4-7 & Phil 2:6-11) but the Passion Reading is taken from St. Mark this year. On Good Friday, every year we read from the Gospel of John.

Jesus' 'triumphal entry' seem like a mockery and a political satire on human craving for power and dominion. Jesus, in orchestrating the whole event of 'entry into Jerusalem' teaches us that he humbly rejects pomp and wealth, and violence but loves to identify with poor. Good social order is possible when we hear and put to work the Word of God.



DEACON'S CORNER

What Is a Permanent Deacon? (Part 4 of 5)

Shortly thereafter, the time became ripe, and the fathers of the Second Vatican Council (1962-65) voted to restore a married permanent diaconate while maintaining a celibate transitional diaconate for those going on to the priesthood. Both forms of the diaconate are sacramentally and canonically equal.

Despite the many decades after the restoration and the number of permanent deacons continually rising, the diaconate still remains a mystery for many. Its absence from the Church for more than a millennium has led to an underdeveloped theology. Along with its placement as a final step in the path to priestly ordination, in the minds of many it is seen as an incomplete order. As a result, deacons are often perceived as “half-baked” priests. Lost in such a misperception is the beauty and grandeur of the order itself and, perhaps most regrettably, a diminishing witness of Christ the Servant to the Church.

Regardless of this lack of theological development in the past, recent insights have helped provide a deeper understanding of the nature and mission of the diaconate. Studying the biblical term diakonia from which we derive the word “servant” or “deacon,” some scholars have concluded that, far from simply helping the needy, the term was used to describe those taking on a special apostolic mission to take the Word of God abroad. Here, the deacon is primarily seen as an envoy or emissary of the apostles and acts with boldness in the exercise of his ministry. Of course, none of this precludes the deacon as a minister of mercy to the poor. That, too, is part of the apostolic mission.

MEMORIALS AND FEASTS THIS WEEK

Palm Sunday (March 24)

1. “*Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord... Hosanna in the highest!*” (Mk 11:9-10). Jesus enters Jerusalem mounted on a colt, according to the words of the prophet: “Tell the Daughter of Zion, Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on an ass, and on a colt, the foal of an ass” (Mt 21:5).

The animal chosen indicates that it was not a triumphal entry, but that of a king meek and humble of heart. However, the multitudes gathered in Jerusalem, almost unaware of this expression of humility or perhaps recognizing in it a messianic sign, greet Christ with words full with joy: “Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!” (Mt 21:9). When Jesus enters Jerusalem, the whole city is in agitation. People are asking themselves, “‘Who is this?’ And the crowds [say], ‘This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth of Galilee’” (Mt 21:10-11).

This was not the first time that the people recognized Christ as the king they expected. It had already happened after the miraculous multiplication of the loaves, when the crowd wanted to carry him in triumph. Jesus knew however that his kingdom was not of this world; for this reason, he had fled from their enthusiasm. He now sets out for Jerusalem to face the trial that awaits him. He is aware that he is going there for the last time, for a “holy” week, at the end of which the passion, cross and death await him. He faces all this with complete willingness, knowing that in this way the Father’s eternal plan will be fulfilled in him.

Since that day, the Church throughout the world has repeated the words of the crowd in Jerusalem: “Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord”. She repeats it every day while celebrating the Eucharist, shortly before the consecration. She repeats it with particular emphasis today, Palm Sunday.

2. The liturgical readings present the suffering Messiah to us. They refer first of all to his sufferings and his humiliation.

The Church proclaims the Gospel of the Lord’s *passion* according to one of the Synoptics; the Apostle Paul, instead, in his Letter to the Philippians, offers us a marvelous synthesis of the mystery of Christ, “who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men.

And being found in human form he humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross” (2:6-11).

This hymn of inestimable theological value presents a complete synthesis of Holy Week, from Palm Sunday through Good Friday to the Sunday of the Resurrection. These words from the Letter to the Philippians, progressively repeated in an ancient responsory, will accompany us throughout the *Triduum Sacrum*.

St Paul's text contains the announcement of the resurrection and glory, but the Liturgy of the Word for Palm Sunday concentrates primarily on the *passion*. Both the first reading and the responsorial psalm speak of it. In the text, which is part of the so-called “songs of the Servant of Yahweh”, the moment of his scourging and his crowning with thorns are sketched out; in the psalm the painful agony of Christ on the cross is described with impressive realism: “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?” (Ps 22 [21]:2). **(St. Pope John Paul II, Palm Sunday, March 23, 1997)**

CHRISM MASS

On Tuesday, March 26, 2024, Bishop James F. Checchio will celebrate the Chrism Mass with the priests of the Diocese. At this Mass, all priests will make a Renewal of Commitment to Priestly Service to the Bishop and the people of God.

The Bishop will also bless and consecrate the Holy Oils, which each parish receives for the rites of anointing. The Oil of Catechumens is used to anoint infants and adults before their Baptism; the Oil of the Sick is used on the forehead and hands of the infirm in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; and Sacred Chrism is used to anoint the head of the newly baptized, the foreheads of *confirmandi*, the hands of a priest at his ordination, the head of a bishop at his ordination, and the altar and walls of new churches.

¡Querida familia!

Al comenzar la Semana Santa de 2024, recordemos que nos esforzamos por ser santos tanto en palabra como en obra, ya que la santidad es abrumadoramente interna. Vemos a Jesús marchando hacia Jerusalén y la gente recibió a Jesús con palmas en las manos mientras las palmas representan la victoria. ¡Quieren que Jesús gane una guerra! ¡Poco sabían contra qué está librando la guerra! Es posible que estemos tan preocupados con las palmas que olvidemos la presencia y la importancia del burro.

Recordemos que esas palmas en realidad son por la paz: ¡el himno real de Jesús es la paz! El "burro" se considera tradicionalmente en el concepto oriental como la imagen de la paz y la humildad. Ya es hora de que nuestras manos se aferren a las palmas que están orientadas hacia el burro mientras nuestro Señor y Salvador cabalga hacia las incursiones de nuestros corazones.

Las Lecturas están organizadas de manera única ya que la 1.^a y 2.^a lectura son las mismas todos los años (Isaías 50:4-7 y Fil. 2:6-11), pero la Lectura de la Pasión está tomada de San Marcos este año. Cada año leemos para el Viernes Santo el Evangelio de Juan.

La “entrada triunfal” de Jesús parece una burla y una sátira política sobre el anhelo humano de poder y dominio. Jesús, al orquestar todo el evento de la “entrada en Jerusalén”, nos enseña que él humildemente rechaza la pompa, la riqueza y la violencia, pero le encanta identificarse con los pobres. El buen orden social es posible cuando escuchamos y ponemos en práctica la Palabra de Dios.


