TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Family!

We continue to reflect the 'Bread of Life' discourse in the Gospel of John. We began reflecting on the 'Bread of Life' discourse in John from the 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time. This week is the fourth installment of the discourse from the same 6th Chapter of John (John 6:51-58). Next Sunday we conclude the discourse by reflecting the last passage (John 60-69). The theme of this Sunday revolves around the Divine Meal. Jesus provides a Divine Meal to nourish us on the journey to salvation. This divine meal is the 'thanksgiving' meal of the Eucharist. In the Old Testament the Israelites called it the 'Todah' meal; that is where we get the word 'Eucharist' from. The early Christians applied the same Greek word 'Eucharist' to the sacred meal Jesus instituted at the Last Supper.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church 2837 states that "Daily" (epiousios) occurs nowhere else in the New Testament. Taken in a temporal sense, this word is a pedagogical repetition of "this day," to confirm us in trust "without reservation." Taken in the qualitative sense, it signifies what is necessary for life, and more broadly every good thing sufficient for subsistence. Taken literally (epi-ousios: "superessential"), it refers directly to the Bread of Life, the Body of Christ, the "medicine of immortality," without which we have no life within us. Finally in this connection, its heavenly meaning is evident: "this day" is the Day of the Lord, the day of the feast of the kingdom, anticipated in the Eucharist that is already the foretaste of the kingdom to come. For this reason, it is fitting for the Eucharistic liturgy to be celebrated each day."

Every human being is blessed with an insatiable longing for God. This hunger for God is so essential for us without which our world will eventually realize the emptiness of our lives without Him.

For the first time the **National March for Life** organization working with Pro-Life groups across New Jersey will be hosting a New Jersey State March for Life on Thursday, September 26, 2024 at 11am. On August 22nd, at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington DC, will be commemorating the **100**th **anniversary** of the first Mass held at the Shrine. Other events are Hispanic Bible Seminars (August 17th & 24th) and the **Life-Giving Wounds Retreat for Adult Children of Divorce** (August 23-24). In addition, the National Eucharistic Revival moves into the missionary phase with the Walk With One campaign.

DEACON'S CORNER

If you haven't had the chance to read the article on this subject from last week, I recommend accessing it first before proceeding. You can find the article online on our website's bulletin section. Reading the article will provide you with important background information to better understand the content that follows.

Hell....Hell in Catholic theology, is often described as a state of eternal separation from God reserved for those who die in a state of mortal sin without repentance. The Catechism of the Catholic Church portrays hell as a place of immense suffering, perpetual remorse, and a fire that torments the soul without consuming it. This depiction serves as a solemn warning about the consequences of rejecting God's love and grace.

Critics of the concept of hell often question how a loving God could condemn anyone to such a fate. They argue that the idea of hell may be a tool used by the Church to instill fear and compliance among believers. However, from a theological perspective, hell is a consequence of the choices individuals make during their lives. It is the result of a deliberate rejection of God's mercy and a refusal to seek forgiveness for one's sins.

The belief is that when individuals persist in a state of sin and fail to seek reconciliation with God through repentance and sacramental grace, they effectively choose to separate themselves from God's love.

In this state of spiritual alienation, they face the prospect of eternal damnation in hell.

The teaching about hell serves as a reminder of the gravity of sin and the importance of seeking reconciliation with God. It underscores the need for a life lived in accordance with God's will, marked by repentance, humility, and a desire for spiritual growth. By embracing God's grace and mercy, individuals can avoid the despair of hell and strive for the ultimate goal of union with God in heaven.

Therefore, the Catholic perspective on hell emphasizes the importance of living a life guided by faith, love, and moral integrity. It encourages believers to turn away from sin, seek forgiveness, and cultivate a deep relationship with God. Through this spiritual journey, individuals can avoid the fate of hell and instead find eternal peace and fulfillment in the presence of God.

August 22nd - Queenship of Mary - Memorial

Pope Pius XII's encyclical letter, *Ad Caeli Reginam*, establishing the Memorial of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary notes in part:

"Let all, therefore, try to approach with greater trust the throne of grace and mercy of our Queen and Mother, and beg for strength in adversity, light in darkness, consolation in sorrow; above all let them strive to free themselves from the slavery of sin and offer an unceasing homage, filled with filial lovalty. to their Queenly Mother. Let her churches be thronged by the faithful, her feast-days honored; may the beads of the Rosary be in the hands of all; may Christians gather, in small numbers and large, to sing her praises in churches, in homes, in hospitals, in prisons. May Mary's name be held in highest reverence, a name sweeter than honey and more precious than jewels; may none utter blasphemous words, the sign of a defiled soul, against that name graced with such dignity and revered for its motherly goodness; let no one be so bold as to speak a syllable which lacks the respect due to her name."

August 23^{rd} - St. Rose of Lima, Virgin - Optional Memorial

August 24th - St. Bartholomew, Apostle - Feast

"Returning to the scene of Nathanael's vocation, the Evangelist tells us that when Jesus sees Nathanael approaching, he exclaims: "Behold, an Israelite indeed, in whom there is no guile!" (Jn 1: 47). This is praise reminiscent of the text of a Psalm: "Blessed is the man... in whose spirit there is no deceit" (32[31]: 2), but provokes the curiosity of Nathanael who answers in amazement: "How do you know me?" (Jn 1: 48).

Jesus' reply cannot immediately be understood. He says: "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you" (Jn 1: 48). We do not know what had happened under this fig tree. It is obvious that it had to do with a decisive moment in Nathanael's life. His heart is moved by Jesus' words, he feels understood and he understands: "This man knows everything about me, he knows and is familiar with the road of life; I can truly trust this man". And so, he answers with a clear and beautiful confession of faith: "Rabbi, you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel!" (Jn 1: 49). In this confession is conveyed a first important step in the journey of attachment to Jesus."

Querida Familia!

Seguimos reflexionando sobre el discurso del "Pan de Vida" en el Evangelio de Juan. Comenzamos a reflexionar sobre el discurso del "Pan de Vida" en Juan el 17º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Esta semana es la cuarta entrega del discurso del mismo capítulo 6 de Juan (Juan 6:51-58). El próximo domingo concluimos el discurso reflexionando sobre el último pasaje (Juan 60-69). El tema de este domingo gira en torno a la Cena Divina. Jesús nos ofrece una Cena Divina para nutrirnos en el camino hacia la salvación. Esta cena divina es la cena de "acción de gracias" de la Eucaristía. En el Antiguo Testamento, los israelitas la llamaban la cena "Todah"; de ahí proviene la palabra "Eucaristía". Los primeros cristianos aplicaban la misma palabra griega "Eucaristía" a la cena sagrada que Jesús instituyó en la Última Cena.

El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, 2837, afirma que las palabras "cada día" (epiousios) no aparece en ningún otro lugar del Nuevo Testamento. En sentido temporal, esta palabra es una repetición pedagógica de "este día" para confirmarnos en la confianza "sin reservas". En sentido cualitativo, significa lo necesario para la vida y, más ampliamente, todo bien suficiente para la subsistencia. En sentido literal (epi-ousios: "superesencial"), se refiere directamente al Pan de Vida, al Cuerpo de Cristo, "medicina de inmortalidad", sin la cual no tenemos vida en nosotros. Finalmente, en este contexto, es evidente su significado celestial: "este día" es el Día del Señor, el día de la fiesta del Reino, anticipado en la Eucaristía que es ya el anticipo del Reino que ha de venir. Por eso conviene que la liturgia eucarística se celebre cada día.

Todo ser humano está dotado de un deseo insaciable de Dios. Esta hambre de Dios es tan esencial para nosotros, sin la cual nuestro mundo eventualmente se dará cuenta del vacío de nuestras vidas sin Él.

Lo mismo con la Confirmación los años de preparación son en los grados séptimo y octavo y al final del octavo grado recibe la Confirmación.



Challenges:

- Given our number of registered parishioners, we have (2300 families), our Faith Formation enrollment has been very challenging in recent years, averaging 130 - 140 children.
- · Many families find it difficult to get their children to Faith Formation on Roseberry Street.
- Many parents wait in the parking lot for an hour to take their children back home.
- Lack of Adult Faith Formation
- Lack of knowledge in learning prayers, availing confessions etc.

Responses:

- · Faith Formation needs to start with an Opening Mass and end with a Thanksgiving Mass.
- Having Faith Formation next to the church, will inspire the children to participate in other aspects of the Mass such as Youth Ministry, Altar Server etc.
- While the children are in class the parents can come into Mercy Hall for an Adult Formation Class.



In order to improve the present situation, we need to begin repairing Mercy Hall and move Faith Formation next to the Church for better access for confession and teaching of the church. We would plan to have a Faith Formation Parent Association to work with our staff in improving enrollment. We would organize monthly Adult Faith Formation sessions at Mercy Hall for parents, when the children are in their classes. More participation from families who find it hard to get a ride to school would be achieved. Monthly confessions for our parents and children can be scheduled.


