Dear Family!

"As this world (Earth) is not for those who are without wealth, so that world (Heaven) is not for those who are without kindness" (Thirukkural 247 written in my mother tongue around Jesus' time). This is the focal point of this week's liturgy. We continue to take great care on our financial security; we work hard at it. Do we take enough care on our spiritual security? This paves way to reflect about an important social evil of our time - Financial Slavery.

Are you stressed out? Are you obsessing over something? Are you keeping secrets on your financial details from your spouse? Do you feel that you can't get ahead in life? Do you feel inadequate or inferior because you don't have certain things? (God, Money and Me with Brian Jewell). We witness serious imbalances of finances in our modern world. We want to talk about these imbalances since they touch on moral issues of justice, the dignity of a people and their rights.

To compliment the aforementioned 'Thirukkural', a famous saying of Jewish rabbis is worth pondering - "The rich help the poor in this world, but the poor help the rich in the world to come. Our true wealth is not in what we keep, but in what we give away."

"Let those of us who possess earthly wealth open our hearts to those who are in need. Let us show ourselves faithful and obedient to the laws of God. Let us be followers of our Lord's will in those things that are from the outside and not our own. Let us do this so that we may receive what is our own, that holy and admirable beauty that God forms in people's souls, making them like himself, according to what we originally were." St. Cyril of Alexandria, Commentary on Luke, Homily 109

Pope Leo XIV's Reflection on The Jubilee of Consolation (September 15, 2025)

"Comfort, O comfort my people" (Is 40:1). This is the appeal voiced by the prophet Isaiah, which continues to resound today, calling us to share God's consolation with so many brothers and sisters who are experiencing situations of frailty, sadness and pain.

We seek for someone to console us and often find no one. At times, we experience difficulty listening to the voices of those who sincerely wish to share our pain. There are situations in which words are not helpful and become almost meaningless. In such moments, perhaps only tears remain, but sometimes even these may have run dry. Pope Francis once called to mind the tears of Mary Magdalene, confused and alone before Jesus 'empty tomb. "She simply weeps," he said. "You see, there are times in our lives when tears are the glasses through which we see Jesus. And what is this woman's message? 'I have seen the Lord."

Tears are a language that express the deep feelings of a wounded heart. Tears are a silent cry for compassion and comfort. They cleanse and purify our eyes, our feelings, and our thoughts. We should not be ashamed to cry; it is a way of expressing our sadness and our desire for a new world. Crying tells of our humanity, which is weak and tested, but destined for joy.

Where there is evil, we must seek the comfort and consolation that can overcome it and give it no respite. In the Church, resting your head on a comforting shoulder, finding someone who cries with you and gives you strength is a medicine that we cannot do without, because it is a sign of love.

Where pain is deep, the hope that comes from communion must be even stronger. And this hope does not disappoint.

By grace, forgiveness has the power to open hearts, regardless of what they have been through. The violence suffered cannot be erased, but forgiveness granted to those who offend us is a foretaste of the Kingdom of God on earth. It is the fruit of God's work that puts an end to evil and establishes justice. Redemption is mercy, and it can bring us a better future, even while we await the Lord's return. He alone will wipe away every tear and open to us the book of history (cf. Rev 5).

Jesus is the Lamb who gives us the Holy Spirit, the Comforter who will never leave us. He comforts us in times of need and strengthens us with his grace (cf. Acts 15:31). Our loved ones who have been separated from us by sister death are not lost and do not fade into the void. Their lives belong to the Lord, the Good Shepherd, who embraces them and holds them close. He will return them to us one day so that, together, we may enjoy eternal happiness.

DEACON'S CORNER

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the story of the dishonest steward. At first, it seems confusing—why would his master praise him for being shrewd after mismanaging his wealth? But Jesus is not praising dishonesty; He is highlighting the steward's creativity, urgency, and decisiveness when faced with a crisis.

The lesson is this: if someone can act so cleverly to secure a future on earth, how much more should we, as children of God, act with wisdom and determination to secure our eternal future? Too often, we are passionate about earthly goals—success, money, comfort—yet slow and hesitant when it comes to prayer, service, or our relationship with God.

Jesus then says clearly: "You cannot serve both God and mammon." Money and possessions are not evil in themselves, but they become dangerous when they rule our hearts. We are stewards, not owners, of what we have. Everything—our time, talents, and treasures—should be used in ways that honor God and help others.

The message is simple but challenging: Be wise for heaven. Use what God has entrusted to you to build up His Kingdom. When we put God first, everything else falls into its right place, and we discover the true riches that never fade—the love of God and eternal life
