

# TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Family!

The Gospel is better proclaimed when loving God and loving neighbor taken together. "The earth herself, burdened and laid waste, is among the most abandoned and maltreated of our poor; she 'groans in travail' (Rom 8:22). We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth (cf. Gen 2:7); our very bodies are made up of her elements, we breathe her air, and we receive life and refreshment from her waters." --Pope Francis

Pope Frances also states, "We need to participate for the common good. Sometimes we hear: a good Catholic is not interested in politics. This is not true: good Catholics immerse themselves in politics by offering the best of themselves so that the leader can govern." (9/16/13)

The readings remind us of the importance of being sensitive to the poor and the needy in the society. Being sensitive to the needs of others is a mark of being a Christian. The rich man in the gospel was condemned for not treating Lazarus as his brother. The bible is filled with instances that prove one point - God takes the side of the poor and needy. In order that God be on our side, every rich person must side with the poor and needy.

The Church has a preferential love for the poor because the Church imitates her founder's compassion toward the poor by working "for their relief, defense, and liberation through numerous works of charity" (CCC 2448). God's justice to the poor is mediated in the most complete, filling and generous way by our Lord Jesus Christ. Our Lord taught his followers to do the same.

# Sept 29 Mon - Feast of Sts. Michael, Gabriel & Raphael, Archangels

"Today, we celebrate three of these Archangels because they played an important role in the history of salvation and also because they play an important role in our journey towards salvation ", the Holy Father said. He described Michael as being "great: the one who fights against the devil", as described in the day's reading from the Book of Revelation (12: 7-12), and the devil as being our enemy: "troubling our lives: he always tries to seduce [us] as he seduced our mother Eve". "This is mine' are the very words of the devil; he wins us over with seduction and then accuses us before God: 'This [one] is mine, I will take him with me". "Michael fights against him", he continued, because the "Lord asked him to fight [the devil] for us who are on our life journey towards heaven; Michael helps us to fight against him and to not be seduced by this evil spirit which deceives us". (Pope Francis on 29th September, 2017)

# Sept 30 Tue - Memorial of St. Jerome, Priest & Doctor of the Church

"In the remotest part of a wild and stony desert, burnt up with the heat of the scorching sun so that it frightens even the monks that inhabit it, I seemed to myself to be in the midst of the delights and crowds of Rome. In this exile and prison to which for the fear of hell I had voluntarily condemned myself, I many times imagined myself witnessing the dancing of the Roman maidens as if I had been in the midst of them: In my cold body and in my parched-up flesh, which seemed dead before its death, passion was able to live. Alone with this enemy, I threw myself in spirit at the feet of Jesus, watering them with my tears, and I tamed my flesh by fasting whole weeks. I am not ashamed to disclose my temptations, but I grieve that I am not now what I then was" ("Letter to St. Eustochium").

"Where did Francis's journey to Christ begin? It began with the gaze of the crucified Jesus. With letting Jesus look at us at the very moment that he gives his life for us and draws us to himself. Francis experienced this in a special way in the Church of San Damiano, as he prayed before the cross which I too will have an opportunity to venerate. On that cross, Jesus is depicted not as dead, but alive! Blood is flowing from his wounded hands, feet and side, but that blood speaks of life. Jesus 'eyes are not closed but open, wide open: he looks at us in a way that touches our hearts. The cross does not speak to us about defeat and failure; paradoxically, it speaks to us about a death which is life, a death which gives life, for it speaks to us of love, the love of God incarnate, a love which does not die, but triumphs over evil and death. When we let the crucified Jesus gaze upon us, we are re-created, we become "a new creation. Everything else starts with this: the experience of transforming grace, the experience of being loved for no merits of our own, in spite of our being sinners. That is why Saint Francis could say with Saint Paul: "Far be it for me to glory except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Gal 6:14)." "We turn to you, Francis, and we ask you: Teach us to remain before the cross, to let the crucified Christ gaze upon us, to let ourselves be forgiven, and recreated by his love." (Pope Francis' Pastoral Visit to Assisi, Friday, Oct 4, 2013)

#### FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTION

#### **DEACON'S CORNER**

In this Gospel, Jesus tells the story of a rich man who lived every day in luxury while a poor beggar named Lazarus lay at his gate, longing for scraps of food. When both die, their destinies are reversed: Lazarus is carried to the bosom of Abraham, while the rich man suffers torment.

The heart of this passage is not simply about wealth, but about our response to the suffering around us. The rich man did not harm Lazarus directly—his sin was indifference. He saw him every day and chose to ignore him.

This is a warning for us: God places the poor, the sick, the lonely, and the forgotten at the "gates" of our lives. How do we respond? Do we walk past, too busy or too comfortable? Or do we notice, stop, and love in action?

Jesus also reminds us that we already have Moses and the prophets—the Word of God is clear about caring for others. We cannot say we didn't know. What matters is whether we let God's Word transform our hearts into compassion.

The final lesson: our choices on earth echo in eternity. Wealth, comfort, or success cannot save us; only love lived out in mercy does. Lazarus had nothing in this life, yet he had faith. The rich man had everything but lacked love—and that was his ruin.

So today, let's ask: Who is the Lazarus at my gate? Is it a neighbor, a family member, someone homeless I pass on the street, or even a co-worker in silent pain? May we not wait until it's too late, but recognize Christ in them now


