Dear Family!

It was wonderful to see all the pets you brought in for a blessing last Sunday. We thank Father Pat for preparing the prayers for the Blessing of Animals. The OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation of Adults) will begin on Sunday, October 19th, and it is our responsibility to journey with them and pray for them. The Faith Formation classes have started, and our children depend on our prayers especially the children who are preparing for Holy Communion and Confirmation.

The Reading this Sunday focus on gratitude, in particular the expression of gratitude God expects from us. In an Interview in 2013, Pope Francis said, 'The thing the church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful; it needs nearness, proximity. I see the church as a field hospital after battle. It is useless to ask a seriously injured person if he has high cholesterol and about the level of his blood sugars! You have to heal his wounds. Then we can talk about everything else."

As generosity is a virtue leaned from God himself, we as Christians, people of God, are given the mandate to love and serve like our Lord and Master Jesus himself. That is our standard with which we minister 'Love like Jesus does'. God distributes favors with absolute freedom and generosity. Naaman the general had to learn that we can never return God for the blessings we received from God The one thing necessary at this stage is grateful acknowledgment.

Both the 'Good' Samaritans are found in the Gospel of Luke. None of them had returned to give praise to God except the stranger. Jesus paid the ransom to redeem us so that we may have life and that life in abundance. This way we were adopted as children of God. Who are the strangers? One could still be part of the family and still be strangers in the eyes of God. We are part of the family of God.

The Pope has appointed Bishop James Checchio as the Coadjutor Archbishop of New Orleans: A 'coadjutor' bishop is appointed to assist the diocesan bishop until his retirement. When the Archbishop of New Orleans retires and the Holy Father accepts his resignation, Bishop Checchio automatically becomes the Archbishop of New Orleans.

In the meantime, Bishop Checchio becomes the Administrator of the Diocese of Metuchen. A Mass of Farewell for Bishop Checchio will be on November 1st, 11am Mass at the Cathedral. Please keep our Bishop in our prayers!

October is dedicated to the Most Holy Rosary:

Marian spirituality on October 12th centers around two major events in 2025: the closing Mass of the Jubilee of Marian Spirituality in Rome, presided over by the Pope, and the feast day of Our Lady of the Pillar, a significant Marian title. The Jubilee is a special event celebrating devotion to Mary, while the feast day commemorates her appearance to Saint James. October 19th there will be a Canonization Mass for 7 blessed. October 19th is also Mission Sunday. Please read our Bishop's letter on Mission Sunday under the memorials & feasts section of the Bulletin.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

With the election of Pope Leo XIV as our Pope this past Spring, a priest who served as a missionary has become our chief Shepherd! Pope Leo served in the missions both as a priest and bishop. I am not sure we have ever had a missionary elected pope in the history of the Church. That makes this October 19, 2025 a very special day as we celebrate World Mission Sunday. We are all called and instructed by Jesus to proclaim the Gospel to all nations. This day becomes our opportunity, united with Catholics around the world, to unite in prayer and solidarity to support the missionary work of the Church, ultimately overseen by our missionary Pope. This year's theme, "Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples," It was particularly moving because, even though it was chosen by Pope Francis, it reflects both the heart of our faith and the vision of our new Holy Father, Pope Leo.

Pope Leo XIV, who spent 22 years of his priestly ministry as a missionary in the remote regions of Peru, reminds us that The Pontifical Mission Societies are "the primary means for awakening missionary responsibility among all the baptized [and for] supporting ecclesial communities in areas where the Church is young." His personal witness deepens the meaning of this year's celebration, inviting us all to renew our commitment to the Church's mission in the world.

It is important for us to remember that the Catholic Church in the United States was itself once a mission territory. Just over a century ago, the faith here was still taking root, supported by the zeal and generosity of Catholics from Europe and beyond, who provided financial assistance, sent priests and religious, and built the parishes and schools that formed the foundation of the Church in this country. Without that missionary support, many of the churches and dioceses we know today would have struggled even more to grow.

In those early years, American Catholics benefited from the same collection we are invited to support, overseen by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, one of four Pontifical Mission Societies.

Now, it is our turn to extend that same generosity to others. We are called to support the missionaries, priests, religious sisters and brothers, and lay leaders who serve in the 1,124 mission territories where the Church is still young, vibrant, and often facing persecution or poverty. These areas, spanning Asia, Africa, Latin America, Oceania, and the Middle East, depend on our prayers and financial support to sustain and expand their efforts to share Christ and his saving words and work.

The second collection on World Mission Sunday (October 19, 2025) supports the work of The Pontifical Mission Societies, the Pope's official means of assisting Catholic communities in the world's poorest and most remote regions. Our contributions provide essential resources for the Church's mission: the formation of seminarians and religious sisters, ensuring that future priests and religious leaders are prepared to serve; the training of lay catechists, who bring the faith to communities that may not have regular access to a priest; education for children in Catholic schools, giving them not only knowledge but also a foundation of faith; medical care in Church-run hospitals and clinics, offering healing and hope where healthcare is scarce; and the construction and maintenance of churches and parish centers, creating sacred spaces where the faithful can gather, worship, and grow in their relationship with Jesus.

Our prayers and sacrifices today ensure that the light of Christ reaches the ends of the earth. The Church's mission is not the responsibility only of those who serve in distant lands; it belongs to all of us by Baptism. Each time we support the missions, we affirm that we are one Church, one family in Christ, united in bringing hope and love to all people.

I encourage you to respond with a generous heart, knowing that your support makes a real difference in the lives of those who might otherwise never hear the Gospel.

May this World Mission Sunday deepen our commitment to the missionary dimension of our faith. Let us go forth as Missionaries of Hope, bringing God's love and mercy to all people. Thank you for all that you do, and know of my love, prayers and gratitude for all of you.

DEACON'S CORNER

Dear Parishioners:

In case you missed it last week...

"Increase our faith," the apostles plead in today's Gospel. Jesus doesn't give them a lecture. He gives them a seed.

"If you had faith the size of a mustard seed," He says, "you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you."

It's a strange image. A tiny seed. A tree in the sea. But Jesus isn't talking about magic tricks. He's talking about trust. About obedience. About the quiet power of faith that moves hearts, not just trees.

And then He shifts gears. He tells a parable about a servant who works all day, comes in from the field, and still prepares dinner for the master. The servant doesn't expect praise. He simply does what is asked.

It's a jarring follow-up. From mustard seed miracles to humble duty. But that's the point.

Faith isn't just about believing big things. It's about doing small things—faithfully.

It's about showing up for the friend who's grieving, even when you don't have the right words. It's about forgiving someone again, even when it's hard. It's about praying when you're tired, serving when you're unseen, loving when it's inconvenient.

Faith isn't flashy. It's steady. It's the quiet "yes" to God, repeated over a lifetime.

As deacons, as disciples, we are not called to be heroes. We are called to be faithful. To plant mustard seeds in the soil of daily life. To serve without seeking applause. To trust that God sees what others don't.

This week let's ask not for more faith—but for the courage to use the faith we already have. Even if it's just the size of a mustard seed.

Como la generosidad es una virtud que proviene de Dios mismo, nosotros, como cristianos, pueblo de Dios, recibimos el mandato de amar y servir como nuestro Señor y Maestro Jesús. Ese es nuestro estándar con el que ministramos: «Amar como Jesús lo hace». Dios distribuye favores con absoluta libertad y generosidad. Naamán, el general, tuvo que aprender que nunca podemos corresponder a Dios por las bendiciones que recibimos de Él. Lo único necesario en esta etapa es el agradecimiento.

Ambos "buenos" samaritanos aparecen en el Evangelio de Lucas. Ninguno de ellos había regresado para alabar a Dios, excepto el forastero. Jesús pagó el rescate para redimirnos y que tuviéramos vida, y vida en abundancia. De esta manera, fuimos adoptados como hijos de Dios. ¿Quiénes son los forasteros? Uno puede seguir siendo parte de la familia y seguir siendo forastero a los ojos de Dios. Somos parte de la familia de Dios.
