## THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

Dear Family!

The readings focus on 'justice'. Our human understanding of 'justice' results from logic - you worked for a month, and you get your pay; you did this and you get that. To be fair there is a balance between an act and a result (reward or punishment). 'Justice' in God's language is rooted in love. God's love is present while we are still sinners (St. Paul). To be just, to be fair in God's language is to be in love. The First Reading reminds us that God's almighty power includes his strength to be merciful.

The story of Zacchaeus is actually the story of God's essence; the story of who God is. Once we learn as to who God is, this same story becomes our story. It becomes our story in three different ways: A) I feel God's call to a holy way of life. I think of one thing that I could work on in my personal life to become a better person this week, this month, this year. B) I feel I need to love like Jesus despite the sins of others (my family, my friends etc.) because God loves me that way. C) I feel God wants me to be generous with my love towards others.

The encounter between Jesus and Zacchaeus embodies divine mercy in action. Zacchaeus, a wealthy tax collector and sinner, climbs a sycamore tree to see Jesus. To his astonishment, Jesus calls him by name and declares, "Today I must stay at your house." In this single act of self-giving love, Jesus transforms Zacchaeus' life; repentance restitution follow naturally from grace received. Jesus' mission statement concludes the episode: "The Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." Divine mercy here is both personal transformative—it restores human dignity and reconciles the sinner to the community. The "house" into which Jesus enters symbolizes the soul renewed by grace.

Catechism 545 sheds more light on Jesus' love for the sinners: "Jesus invites *sinners* to the table of the kingdom: "I came not to call the righteous, but sinners." He invites them to that conversion without which one cannot enter the kingdom but shows them in word and deed his Father's boundless mercy for them and the vast "joy in heaven over one sinner who repents". The supreme proof of his love will be the sacrifice of his own life "for the forgiveness of sins"

## The Pope has appointed Bishop James Checchio as the Coadjutor Archbishop of New Orleans:

The Church of Metuchen had a farewell Mass for Bishop Checchio on November 1<sup>st</sup> at the Cathedral. Please keep our Bishop in your prayers! We will continue to mention Bishop Checchio's name until the afternoon of Tuesday, November 18<sup>th</sup>. (That is when Bishop Checchio will be named the Coadjutor Bishop). Our diocese will become vacant, and we will not mention Bishop's name until we get a new Bishop.

I would like to update you on some significant historical milestones in the History of the Catholic Church. The council of Nicaea was a gathering of three hundred bishops (church leaders) from around the Christian world. They convened in Nicaea (near Istanbul in modern-day Türkiye) on May 20, 325 and concluded a month later on June 19<sup>th</sup> when they formally ratified a creed. This creed affirmed the church's faith that the Son is just as fully God as the Father. Pope Leo's Apostolic Journey to Türkiye and Lebanon is scheduled in November (Nov 27<sup>th</sup> to Dec 2<sup>nd</sup>).

Sixty years ago, on 28 October 1965, the Seventh Session of the Second Vatican Ecumenical Council was held. Today, I would like to call to mind the five Documents that the Pope Paul VI and the Council Fathers signed on 28 October 1965. They are: the Decree Christus Dominus on the pastoral office of Bishop; the Decree Perfectae Caritatis on the renewal of Religious life; the Decree Optatam Totius on the formation of priests; the Declaration Gravissimum Educationis on Christian education; and lastly, the Declaration Nostra Aetate on the relations of the Church to non-Christian religions.

Pope Leo addressed the world during the prayer service for peace along with Religious leaders of the world said, "The world is thirsting for peace. We need a true and sound era of reconciliation that puts an end to the abuse of power, displays of force and indifference to the rule of law. Enough of war, with all the pain it causes through death, destruction and exile! Gathered here today, we express not only our firm desire for peace, but also our conviction that prayer is a powerful force for reconciliation. Those who practice religion without prayer run the risk of misusing it, even to the point of killing. Prayer is a movement of the spirit and an opening of the heart.

On 27 October 1986, Saint John Paul II invited religious leaders from around the world to Assisi to pray for peace, imploring them: let us never again go against each other, but stand alongside each other. This historic event marked a turning point in interfaith relations. Year after year, these meetings of prayer and dialogue have continued in the "spirit of Assisi," creating a climate of friendship among religious leaders and welcoming many appeals for peace. Today, it seems that the world has gone in the opposite direction, but we embrace the challenge of Assisi and the awareness of our shared task and responsibility for peace. I thank the Community of Sant'Egidio and all the Catholic and non-Catholic organizations, which keep this spirit alive, even going against the tide.

For the Catholic Church, prayer in the "spirit of Assisi" is based on the solid foundation set out in the Second Vatican Council's Declaration Nostra Aetate. namely, the renewal of the relationship between the Catholic Church and other religions. Today we celebrate the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the promulgation of this Declaration, which took place on 28 October 1965. Together we reaffirm our commitment to dialogue and to fraternity, a commitment desired by the Council Fathers that has borne much fruit. In the words of the Council: "We cannot truly pray to God as Father of all if we treat any people as other than sisters and brothers, for all are created in God's image" (Declaration on the Relationship of the Church to Non-Christian Religions Nostra Aetate, 5). All believers are brothers and sisters. And religions, as "mothers," must encourage peoples to treat each other as family, not as enemies. For "humanity forms but one community. This is so because all stem from one stock".

### **DEACON'S CORNER**

### The Bread of Life

This is one of the greatest passages in John's gospel, and indeed of the New Testament. There are lines of thought that we must try to analyze.

What is life? Clearly, life is something far more than the physical existence. It is not only the physical existence but the spiritual. Let us explore the spiritual meaning of life.

Real life is the relationship of trust and love for God. That relationship is made possible only with Jesus Christ. Apart from Him no one can enter into it. That is to say, without Jesus life does not exist. Jesus is the essential creator of life. He is the Bread of Life. The hunger of the human soul is nourished when we know Christ. By allowing Jesus into our hearts, we encounter God. The restless souls begin the journey in satisfying the hungry heart.

The passage opens the stages of Christian life. We hear about Jesus in the pages of the New Testament, and in the teaching of the church. We regard Him not as some distant hero, not as a figure in a book, but as someone accessible to us. The invitation is to all people. The Bread of Life is ours for the taking. The only way to a new relationship is through Jesus, without Him it never would have been possible, and apart from Him it is impossible. No searching of the human mind or longing of the human heart can fully find God apart from Jesus. The Bread of Life is there for the taking or the refusing. The choice is up to us!!!







### CONMEMORACIÓN DE LOS FIELES DIFUNTOS

¡Querida familia!

Las lecturas se centran en la justicia. Nuestra comprensión humana de la justicia se basa en la lógica: trabajaste un mes y recibiste tu salario; hiciste esto y recibiste algo. Para ser justos, debe haber un equilibrio entre la acción y el resultado (recompensa o castigo). La justicia, en el lenguaje de Dios, tiene su raíz en el amor. El amor de Dios está presente aun cuando somos pecadores (San Pablo). Ser justo, ser equitativo, en el lenguaje de Dios, es amar. La primera lectura nos recuerda que el poder omnipotente de Dios incluye su fuerza para ser misericordioso.

La historia de Zaqueo es, en realidad, la historia de la esencia de Dios; la historia de quién es Dios. Una vez que comprendemos quién es Dios, esta misma historia se convierte en nuestra historia. Se convierte en nuestra historia de tres maneras diferentes:

- A) Siento el llamado de Dios a una vida santa. Pienso en algo que podría mejorar en mi vida personal para ser mejor persona esta semana, este mes, este año.
- B) Siento que debo amar como Jesús a pesar de los pecados de los demás (mi familia, mis amigos, etc.) porque Dios me ama así.
- C) Siento que Dios quiere que sea generoso con mi amor hacia los demás.

El encuentro entre Jesús y Zaqueo encarna la misericordia divina en acción. Zaqueo, un rico recaudador de impuestos y pecador sube a un sicómoro para ver a Jesús. Para su asombro, Jesús lo llama por su nombre y le dice: «Hoy debo hospedarme en tu casa». En este sencillo acto de amor abnegado, Jesús transforma la vida de Zaqueo; arrepentimiento y la restitución surgen naturalmente de la gracia recibida. La declaración de misión de Jesús concluye el episodio: «El Hijo del Hombre vino a buscar y a salvar lo que se había perdido». La misericordia divina aquí es a la vez personal y transformadora: restaura la dignidad humana y reconcilia al pecador con la comunidad. La «casa» en la que entra Jesús simboliza el alma renovada por la gracia.

El Catecismo 545 arroja más luz sobre el amor de Jesús por los pecadores: «Jesús invita a los pecadores a la mesa del reino: "No he venido a llamar a justos, sino a pecadores". Los invita a esa conversión sin la cual no se puede entrar en el reino, pero les muestra con palabras y obras la infinita misericordia de su Padre y la inmensa "alegría en el cielo por un pecador que se arrepiente". La prueba suprema de su amor será el sacrificio de su propia vida "para el perdón de los pecados"».
