OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Dear Family!

Reflecting on the Gospel this Sunday, St. Ambrose wrote, "The superscription is written and placed above, not below the cross, because the government is upon his shoulders. What is this government if not his eternal power and Godhead? When asked, "Who are you?" he replied, "The beginning, who also speaks to you." Let us read this superscription. "Jesus of Nazareth," it says, "The King of the Jews." The superscription is fittingly above the cross because Christ's kingdom does not belong to his human body but to his divine authority. The superscription is also fittingly above the cross, because although the Lord Jesus was on the cross, he shines above the cross with the majesty of a king." (Exposition of the Gospel of Luke)

The Universal Church celebrates the Solemnity of Christ the King this Sunday. As we know from the gospels that Jesus revealed His Kingdom is not of this world. Yet Jesus taught us to pray for that coming of that Kingdom which is not of this world (Your Kingdom come!). When Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in 1925, he wanted the Church to experience the peace of Christ. (Pax Christi in regno Christi). We live in that peace when we surrender our lives to Christ thus Christ rules our lives.

As Christ is the King, how do we participate in Christ's Kingly Office? The Catechism teaches us "By his obedience unto death,444 Christ communicated to his disciples the gift of royal freedom, so that they might "by the self-abnegation of a holy life, overcome the reign of sin in themselves": Quoting St. Ambrose the Catechism continues, "That man is rightly called a king who makes his own body an obedient subject and, by governing himself with suitable rigor, refuses to let his passions breed rebellion in his soul, for he exercises a kind of royal power over himself. And because he knows how to rule his own person as king, so too does he sit as its judge. He will not let himself be imprisoned by sin or thrown headlong into wickedness."

<u>SUMMARY OF MATER POPULI FIDELIS -</u> New Document on Titles of Mary

On November 7th, the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith published a new document called 'Mater Populi Fidelis' a Doctrinal Note on Some Marian Titles regarding Mary's Cooperation in the Work of Salvation. The purpose is it to deepen Marian devotion's foundations while strengthening Catholic identity and encouraging ecumenical sensitivity.

Doctrinal Clarification of Marian Titles

- Co-redemptrix:
 - Originated as a correction to "Redemptrix"—meaning primarily "Mother of the Redeemer"—in the 15th century.
 - Some Popes have used it but without precise dogmatic definition, reflecting her union with Christ at the Cross.
 - Vatican II and recent popes have discouraged this title due to risk of confusion, stressing Christ's unique mediation and redemption.
 - Cardinal Ratzinger (Pope Benedict XVI) and Pope Francis explicitly rejected "Co-redemptrix," emphasizing that Christ alone is Redeemer and that such titles risk theological imbalance.

• Mediatrix:

- This title developed in both Eastern and Western Christianity, recognizing that Mary had a real mediatory role by enabling the Incarnation ("born of a woman"), and at Cana, as an intercessor.
- only in a subordinate, non-efficacious sense, and preferred terms like "cooperation" and "maternal assistance."

- Christ is the sole Mediator; Mary's mediation never obscures Christ's exclusivity.
- Mother of Believers/Faithful:
 - Scripturally and Tradition-rooted, this title is emphasized as theologically sound.
 - Her "spiritual motherhood" springs from her physical motherhood of Christ and includes all members of the Mystical Body.
 - Her intercession is maternal, never priestly, arising from close union with Christ and the Church.

So, the title, 'Co-Redemptrix' is not approved, and it is discouraged. Thus, it is not to be used in doctrine or devotion. 'Mediatrix' has a subordinate sense as Mary mediates by cooperation, but mediation is exclusively Christ's, Thus, the pastoral guide prefers 'cooperation' and 'maternal help'. 'Mother of Believers' is approved & encouraged as the main Marian paradigm.

Mater Populi Fidelis provides a nuanced and biblically-rooted framework for understanding Marian devotion. It calls for clarity, fidelity, and discernment in naming and describing Mary's role, insisting that all authentic Marian theology and piety highlight the singular primacy of Christ and the unique, subordinate, and maternal cooperation of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the divine plan of salvation.

As of January 4, 2026 the St. Philip & St. James Church Sunday Mass Schedule will be as follows:

9am, 11am, & 5:30pm in English, & 1pm in Spanish.

(There will no longer be a 7am mass.)

The Promise of Paradise

Jesus said many great things, but nothing more compassionate than, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." (Luke 23:34) When Stephen was being stoned to death he too prayed, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them." (Acts 7:60). It was more than immortality that Jesus promised the penitent thief. He promised him the honor of companion in heaven's garden "paradise." The moral of this story, it is never too late to turn to Christ. As long as a person's heart beats, the invitation to come to Jesus Christ still stands now and forever. Vivimos en esa paz cuando entregamos nuestras vidas a Cristo, de modo que Cristo gobierna nuestras vidas.

Siendo Cristo Rey, ¿cómo participamos en su Realeza? El Catecismo nos enseña: «Por su obediencia hasta la muerte, 444 Cristo comunicó a sus discípulos el don de la libertad real, para que, mediante la abnegación de una vida santa, pudieran vencer el dominio del pecado en sí mismos». 
